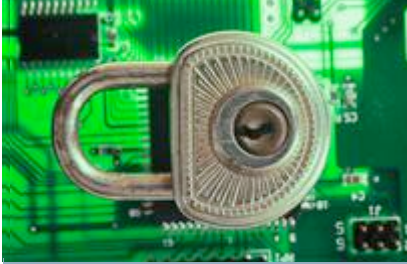

## IDENTITY AND ACCESS MANAGEMENT

### SINGLE SIGN ON

Log in once to get access to your applications - not the 42 times per shift of one hospital

### PASSWORD SYNCH

Consistent, secure passwords across systems - good for users, required by management

### AUDIT AND PRIVACY

The Clooney effect. It's getting more difficult every year - more systems, more data on-line, more people involved... and then there's HIPAA and SOX

### PROVISIONING

It's 6pm on Friday - did all those accounts get turned off for the guy who was fired... and did we create ALL the accounts for those people starting at 9am on Monday? It's not just email accounts anymore.

## The simple problem...

Who are you, and what do you get access to... and when do you get that access, and where do you get it, and what do you do if you are locked out?

These are all simple enough questions, but the solutions to the associated problems can get buried under an avalanche of technical, political, organizational and financial issues.

This is further complicated by the current pace of business, the wider reach of an organization across partners and affiliates, and a rapidly changing technical infrastructure - can you spell LDAP, SAML, SSPR, CCOW, RBAC, ESSO, RSO, OTP, GINA, ILP?

The dream of a single centralized directory of all user data is long gone. Silos of data are a fact of life within any organization, and the problem just compounds as the boundaries between organizations become fuzzier.

VPN, Blackberries and iPhones, and fast networks make it even more difficult as the physical boundaries of a business have less relevance to the boundaries of IT systems - users are getting used to the idea of anytime, anywhere access.

There are also more challenges ahead as organizations face new business requirements:

- ◆ Linking digital & physical identity
- ◆ RFID
- ◆ Biometrics
- ◆ Federation

This isn't a problem that will go away. In most organizations, the implementation of new systems is moving faster than the implementation of the IAM infrastructure to support it.

There are many solutions available, and many can be implemented in a surprisingly short time frame.
